



#### **HE Synthesis Fabrication and Production (HESFP)**


- The High Explosive Synthesis, Formulation, and Production (HESFP) facility will consist of approximately 98,500 square feet of structure and will be capable of manufacturing 25,000 to 50,000 pound of High Explosive annually
- The HESFP facility will replace 24 aging facilities, some dating back to World War II
- Total Project Cost range is \$505M to \$699M
- The Request for Proposal for the main facilities construction is planned to be issued July 2023

#### Y-12 - FY23 Projected Awards

- FY22 \$108M Awarded
- \$119M Total Projected for FY23
  - \$34M awarded in Q1
  - \$85M remaining to be awarded

#### **Bond Requirements**

#### **Construction Subcontracts**

The Miller Act, 40 U.S.C. 2701–270 paragraph (f), requires performance and payment bonds or alternate payment protection for any construction, alteration, or repair of any public building or public work valued over \$150,000.

- > \$150,000
  - Proposal Guarantee, UCN-22423
  - Payment Bond, UCN-22410
  - Performance Bond, UCN-22412
  - Must be equal to 100% of the original awarded subcontract price and as increased.

#### >\$35,000; <\$150,000

- Fixed-Price
- Unit-Priced
- Cost-Reimbursement
- Must select two or more payment protections

See FAR 28.102-2, and PPD 7.5.7 Amount required, paragraph (c), giving particular consideration to the inclusion of an <u>irrevocable letter of credit</u> as one of the selected alternatives.

#### **Bond Requirements cont.**

#### **Irrevocable Letter of Credit**

Any person required to furnish a bond has the option to furnish a bond secured by an Irrevocable Letter of Credit (ILC) in an amount equal to the penal sum required to be secured.

The ILC must be issued or confirmed by an acceptable federally insured financial institution rated investment grade or better. The ILC must be irrevocable, unconditional, and unexpired

#### **Payment Bonds**

Assure payments as required by law to all persons supplying labor or material to execute the work provided for in the contract.

#### **Performance Bonds**

Secure performance and fulfill of the contractor's obligations under the contract.

The bonds must bear a seal and be issued by an acceptable surety as identified by Treasury Department Circular 570.

### **Bond Requirements cont.**

#### **Modifications**

-When a subcontract is modified, the Procurement Representative must obtain the consent of the surety or request an undated bond.

#### Required when:

- An additional bond is obtained from other than the original surety.
- No additional bond is required, and;
  - -The modification is for new work beyond the scope of the original contract; or
  - -The modification does not change the contract scope but changes the contract price (upward or downward) by more than 25% or \$50,000. See FAR 28 .106-5, Consent of Surety, for additional information.
  - -Bond must be equal to 100% of the original awarded subcontract price and increased to match further funding unless the Procurement Representative determines that a lesser percentage would protect the Company adequately. (see FAR 28.102 for further detail)

#### **Insurance Requirements**


- Suppliers must carry required insurance when performing work on-site.
  - For off-site work, suppliers may be required to carry insurance when necessary to protect the interest of the Company and the Government.
  - Access to Y-12 Section 8, Access to Pantex Section 16
- Supplier's insurance certificates must be in the Company's possession before the supplier starts any on-site work, and no later than 10 days after award.
- Suppliers working on site must maintain the following insurance:
  - Workers' compensation
  - Employers' liability
  - Commercial general liability
  - Comprehensive automobile liability
  - Equipment liability
  - Builders risk (for construction subcontracts only)

#### **Insurance Requirements cont.**

#### Insurance certificate must include:

- Subcontract number
- Company as the certificate holder
- An endorsement that the Seller must provide 30 days' written notice (or period prescribed by the State where work is performed) to CNS before cancellation, termination, or material alteration of policies
- Additional Insureds and Waiver of Subrogation policy endorsements (for CNS and DOE), or comparable policy language.
- Supplier must provide the policy schedule showing the endorsements are incorporated in the applicable policy

#### **Small Business Subcontracting Plan Overview**

## Consolidated Nuclear Security, LLC (CNS) maintains a Small Business Subcontracting Plan per the Prime Contract

- Includes CNS annual small business goals
- Includes approved subcontracting goal percentages and spend with small, small disadvantaged, HUBZone, women-owned, veteran-owned, and service disabled veteran owned small businesses.

# CNS is required to flow-down this requirement to all subcontracts to large businesses receiving subcontracts exceeding, or expected to exceed \$750,000 (\$1.5 million for construction)

- FAR 52.219-9, Small Business Subcontracting Plan
- When subcontracting possibilities exist
- Plan must be acceptable

#### **Small Business Subcontracting Plan Overview**

## Subcontracting Plan submittal requirements do not generally apply to:

- Small businesses
- Personal services subcontracts
- Subcontracts where no subcontracting possibilities exist
  - Review and approval required (UCN-22349, Representations Regarding Subcontracting Plans)
- Subcontracts to be performed exclusively outside the United States
- Subcontracts for commercial items and services

#### **Small Business Subcontracting Plan Reporting**

Contractually, Prime Contractors and Subcontractors are required to report subcontract activity through the electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS).

Reporting dates and deadlines are as follows:

- Two reports required for entry into eSRS
  - Individual Summary Report (ISR)
    - Due <u>April 30th</u> for the period ended <u>March 31st</u>; and
    - Due October 30th for the period ended September 30th
    - Final report is due within 30 days after subcontract completion
    - Required when due, regardless of whether or not there has been any subcontracting activity
  - Subcontract Summary Report (SSR)
    - Due <u>Annually</u> for the period ending <u>September 30th</u>
    - Required when due, regardless of whether or not there has been any subcontracting activity

#### **Small Business Subcontracting Plan Reporting**

- You must set-up an account at <u>www.esrs.gov</u>
- Data should automatically populate/transfer from SAM and FPDS-NG
- There are Contractor Guides that may provide additional information for your use in getting started.
- Additional/Supplemental information specific to CNS needed for proper routing and review includes:
  - Contractor Awarding the Contract:
    - Consolidated Nuclear Security, LLC
  - Prime Contract Number:
    - DENA0001942 This is the CNS Prime Contract Number
  - Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) of the Contractor that made the Award
    - EWV8QKG1JUV7 "Unique Entity ID (SAM) of next higher tier" This is the UEI Number for CNS

#### **Small Business Subcontracting Plan Reporting**

- Subcontract Number
  - This is the Contract Number on the agreement provided by your Procurement Representative
- Email Addresses Required:
  - Individual Summary Report (ISR)
    - esrsreporting@cns.doe.gov "Email address of the next higher tier" –
      Please use this email address and not the buyer email. This is the
      target email address, which will route the ISR to appropriate CNS
      personnel for review and acceptance.
    - CNS Buyer should also be included in Block 15 of submission
  - Subcontract Summary Report (SSR)
    - nnsa.smallbusiness@nnsa.doe.gov Please include this email address in Block 15 of the SSR report to ensure proper routing for review and acceptance. This is in addition to the email addresses referenced above.

  - SAM registrations have to be renewed annually

  - For assistance (create an incident report or initiate a live chat) visit the Federal Services Desk at: <a href="https://www.fsd.gov">https://www.fsd.gov</a>.
  - Initiate registration renewal no later than one month before expiration.
  - To avoid delays, Register/Renew via sam.gov, not a third party.
